Growing Together!

As you sow, so shall you reap. This is what we got to experience in community garden throughout 2016. Burnaby Neighbourhood House was offered a 1000 sq. ft. educational plot in May 2016 by Burnaby Region Allotment Gardens Association. The purpose was to learn the art of growing food in an urban community and to grow, share and eat together. All the food grown in the community garden here is intended to be used towards Burnaby Neighbourhood House, seniors programs, afterschool programs, community dinners and as well as giving to those in need.

In 2016, we cleaned up the whole plot which was covered with horsetail weed and tried to grow food like kale, lettuce, tomatoes etc. As people volunteered, they gained hands-on experience like sowing, planting and cultivating and exchanging knowledge about how to maintain. It was 'a big learning curve' for many.

Our mission for 2017 is to fix up the greenhouse and grow vegetables as per the season and have an organized method to plant and cultivate. We will be doing this by having one big work day per month and small work days in a week. It is our desire that through our community garden plot that we continue to educate ourselves about how our surroundings work and where all our food comes from and the hard work involved behind it. Welcoming Seniors' Spaces (a Seniors' Impact Plan project)

The role of the Greater Vancouver Seniors' Impact Plan is to reduce seniors' isolation and to be "Allies in Aging." The project was funded for three years by Gov't of Canada, New Horizons for Seniors. There are four pillars serving the region – Welcoming Spaces, Seniors on the Move, Volunteers and Navigators and the Seniors' Hub. The goal of this grant is to build capacity on existing programs not create new programs and the strength in this project lies in the opportunity to intentionally collaborate on initiatives. This limits the costly heuristic approach, creates best learning practices and builds sustainability.

The collaborators on this project are – North Shore Neighbourhood House, Burnaby Community Services, Share Family Services, Frog Hollow Neighbourhood House, Kiwassa Neighbourhood House and each has created their own Welcoming Space.

Burnaby Neighbourhood House is the steward of the Welcoming Seniors' Spaces part of the overall project because of the work already being done by our Seniors' Outreach Ambassador program. The Outreach Ambassador program was strategically developed after a lengthy needs analysis so it was built on rich data gathered throughout the Burnaby community. The program has grown to 33 active volunteers who serve as advisers, facilitate outreach strategies, and be the welcoming committee to all the seniors programs at Burnaby Neighbourhood House.

The volunteers who are themselves seniors, are trained to provide community resources, be empathetic, listen to understand the concerns, invite and refer seniors to the many services in their community.
