Asset Based Community Development- A Focus of Community Engagement

"Asset Based Community Development (ABCD) is a strategy for sustainable community-driven development. Beyond the mobilization of a particular community, ABCD is concerned with how to link micro-assets to the macro-environment. The appeal of ABCD lies in its premise that communities can drive the development process themselves by identifying and mobilizing existing, but often unrecognized assets, and thereby responding to and creating local economic opportunity."

"ABCD builds on the assets that are already found in the community and mobilizes individuals, associations, and institutions to come together to build on their assets—not concentrate on their needs. An extensive period of time is spent in identifying the assets of individuals, associations, and then institutions before they are mobilized to work together to build on the identified assets of all involved. Then the identified assets from an individual are matched with people or groups who have an interest or need in that asset. The key is to begin to use what is already in the community. In the past when a person had a need they went to their neighborhood for assistance. But this has shifted today to the belief that the neighbor does not have the skills to help them, therefore we must go to a professional for assistance." - The Asset-Based Community Development Institute (ABCD), Northwestern University.

Through its existence the Burnaby Neighbourhood House has been guided by ABCD to engage community and create a supportive environment where both professionals and average citizens have an opportunity to help those in need and building a sense of community. As a vibrant organization the Burnaby Neighbourhood House expresses the values of people who live in our community through facilitating the principles of sharing of assets that benefit of others. Examples could be considered in our programs such as Adult Literacy, Computer Café, ESL Classes, Income Tax Clinic, Multi-lingual Interpretation Service and more. Another role of the Burnaby Neighbourhood House is providing opportunities for social interaction of community residents. Through individual volunteer contribution as well as partnership with other organizations an array of social events and community gatherings takes place on regular basis. These events not only bring together long-term residents, but also connect newcomers to the community as a whole and to their neighbours in particular, thus playing an important role in broadening their social network. This is certainly the case within our Community Dinners, Sharing Cultures Events, Seniors Together Events, Summer BBQs, Street Parties, and Youth Events. Our staff and volunteers also play a crucial role in engaging our community through partnerships with other organizations in organizing events such as public consultations, community clean up events, multicultural festivals, city fairs, and many more, where residents of all ages, cultures, and abilities recognize that while there are many differences that separate us, a connection between us through our community engagement is a healthy and supportive factor in our lives.
